

JJ Klein Scholarship

The JJ Klein Scholarship was generously established by Joyce and Jerry Klein and supports Alaskan students seeking post-secondary education. The scholarship is open to graduating high school seniors and students already pursuing a post-secondary education at an accredited college, university or vocational school. Preference will be given to applicants with a GPA from 2.0 to 3.2; those with GPAs above 3.5 will not be considered. Applicants must have demonstrated financial need.

The JJ Klein scholarship will provide a one-time award of up to \$10,000. **Deadline for applications is Sunday, May 17 at 9:00 PM.**

Qualifications:

- Applicant must be a graduate/in their senior year at an Alaskan high school
- Applicant should demonstrate motivation to succeed
- Applicant must be enrolled full-time in an accredited institute of higher education or vocational school for the upcoming academic year
- Applicant must have demonstrated financial need
- Preference will be given to applicants with a GPA from 2.0 to 3.2; those with GPAs above 3.5 will not be considered.

Application Process:

The scholarship application must be completed through The Alaska Community Foundation's (ACF) online application system. The online application can be accessed through http://alaskacf.org/scholarships-overview.

<u>IMPORTANT</u>: Successful applicants must submit their student ID number and program information to ACF before their award can be disbursed. If this information is unavailable at the time of application, submit by email (<u>info@alaskacf.org</u>) or phone (907)-334-6700 as soon as it becomes available.

Forfeiture of Award:

The applicant understands the award could be rescinded in any of the following circumstances:

- Does not enroll full-time for the semester/quarter in which the award is to be in effect.
- Is placed on academic and/or disciplinary probation.
- No longer meets the scholarship qualifications.
